Ministry of Waste, a social enterprise registered in the UK and Indonesia, creates and executes waste management systems to address the emergency of growing waste mismanagement. PT. MOW is a waste management company that builds and operates Integrated Waste Management Facilities in Indonesia. Our facilities help local governments combat their waste problems and allow for the supply of processed material to domestic recyclers.

My responsibilities are creating a strategy to build partnerships with various levels of government, companies, and organizations. I conduct meetings and give presentations to the Governors and Mayors at the regional level, the provincial governments, and also national governments, such as the Ministry of Investment and the Ministry of Environment and Forestry. I'm also involved and helping with the feasibility study of our project, meeting with many recycling companies and discussing partnerships and collaboration with them, as well as building partnerships with the local community to create an educational program at village, district, and regional levels.

Citizen OS is a non-profit organization that provides an open-source e-democracy platform and raises awareness about online civic engagement through our e-democracy projects. Our mission is to empower as many individuals as possible to participate in respectful, meaningful discussions. We aim to facilitate collective decisions on issues that directly affect people's well-being. Citizen OS Foundation has its head office in Estonia which is located at Telliskivi Creative City, Telliskivi 601/3, Tallinn 10412 Estonia, EU with registration number 90014709. In Indonesia, it is known as Citizen OS Indonesia and registered under the name of Citizen Participation Foundation Indonesia. www.citizenos.com.

My responsibilities as a Head of Citizen OS Indonesia are engaging new partners with the Citizen OS platform by building relationships with local governments and grassroots communities, making demos and proposing the best solutions that the COS platform can provide for the potential partners, and managing the communication between the partners and the product owner.

Every year, I lead e-democracy projects such as the Indonesia Opinion Festival, where almost 4000 participants are involved in online and offline discussion, ideas gathering & voting through an e-democracy platform. 150 speakers, 90 community partners, 50 media partners, and 234 volunteers were helping at the event. We also conducted a Youth E-Engagement program as one of the outcomes of the Opinion Festival. Where we trained more than 70 young leading representatives of 50 communities, who had the opportunity to join the training. 20 social projects were implemented, and 6 social projects acquired funding, including from the Ministry of Youth & Sport as one of our partners, as well as from the regional level of government such as the Governor.

2016-2018: Program Coordinator of Indonesia Expat

Indonesia Expat is Indonesia's largest expatriate readership media company which publishes biweekly news and is distributed all over Indonesia, from Sumatra in the West to West Papua in the East. I led the program events organized by our media company. Most of the program events were about connecting businesses with expatriates who live in Indonesia and meeting locals to build a strong relationship. I led the Cleanup Jakarta Day project, the annual event brings more than 1 million volunteers across Jakarta to join the cleanup movement. We collaborated with the government and invited businesses in Jakarta to join. We worked with cross-media companies as well.

I led all the programs including being responsible for supporting the Board's regular meetings, managing annual gatherings, coordinating alumni activities, and field traveling. I was leading the International Day of Peace in 2016 involving more than one thousand volunteers. Our main activities are the Youth Adventure & Youth Leaders Forum, the Youth Leadership Homestay Program in Australia, Japan, and the Netherlands, and the Giving Back Programs by alumni across the regions in Indonesia.

2013-2015: Program Officer of Wahid Foundation

Wahid Foundation was launched on September 7, 2004. Founded by the 4th Indonesia President, KH. Abdurrahman Wahid. It was founded during a time when the world had not yet healed from the pain and panic caused by the 11/9/2001 tragedy in New York, and when Indonesia had been experiencing numerous outbreaks of communal violence triggered by disputes in the name of religion and ethnic identity. Violent incidents broke out all around the country and touched even the nation's big cities. The Wahid Foundation was established to advance the humanitarian vision of KH. Abdurrahman Wahid (Gus Dur) in advancing the development of tolerance, and diversity in Indonesian society, increasing the welfare of the poor, building democracy and fundamental justice, and expanding the values of peace and non-violence in Indonesia and throughout the whole world. <https://wahidfoundation.org/>.

I was working on a youth campaign and advocacy division with a focus on religious freedom issues. I was responsible for conducting training, encouraging, and developing youths in Indonesia to participate actively in peace campaigns. I was a coordinator for International Day of Peace 2014 involving 1600 volunteers in Jakarta and was awarded an Indonesia Museum Record (MURI) for the organization that runs the Peace Festival with the most enormous number of communities of participants.
